### **About the library**

There are people who work at the library who I can talk to.



The library is usually a quiet place where people talk quietly, relax and read.



Sometimes it might be noisy. If it is too noisy, I can ask a librarian to help.













#### How I become a member of the library

To join the library, I need to visit this desk to speak to a librarian.

I will tell the librarian my name, address, date of birth, telephone number and email address and they will put it on the computer.



I will be given a library card with my name on.

## When I visit the library

In the library there are shelves of books.



I can sit in the library and read books.



I can also borrow books and take them home with me.













If I want to borrow a book I will talk to a librarian or use the self-issue machine.



These are the self-issue machines that I can use to borrow and return books.

When I return my books, I may need to put them on the bookshelf or in the returns bin. The machine will tell me what to do with each book.

When I have finished, I will leave the library.













## Using the computers at the library

The library also has some computers.



The computers are free to use, but I need to talk to a member of staff before I use it for the first time to be given a PIN card to use on the computers.



I can choose which computer to use and use my library card number and PIN number to log on.



When I have finished, I will leave the library.
