### **NOTICE OF PROPOSAL TO MAKE A GATING ORDER**

#### **STAFFORDSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (RESERVOIR ROAD TO B.O.A.T. 18 CANNOCK TOWN) GATING ORDER 2008.**

**NOTICE** Is hereby given that Staffordshire County Council, being the Highway Authority for the Public Highway, known as as Byway Open to All Traffic (B.O.A.T.) No 18 Cannock Town, leading from its junction with Reservoir Road, and comprising the length of the aforementioned highway, propose to make a Gating Order under S129A of the Highways Act 1980 (“the Act”) for the Public Highway aforementioned.

When the Order comes into effect the Public Right of Way over the section of the specified highway described above, and shown on the plan annexed to the Order, shall be restricted for all classes of public user except pedestrians at all times by means of a gate or barrier.

The alternative route for equestrians and cyclists is via Public Bridleways 15 and 17 Cannock Town. There are no alternative routes available for vehicular traffic.

#### **Schedule**

##### **Draft Gating Order**

##### **Staffordshire County Council (Reservoir Road To B.O.A.T. 18 Cannock Town) Gating Order 2008.**

This Order is made by Staffordshire County Council (“the Authority”) under Section 129A of the Highways Act 1980 because it appears to the Authority that a Gating Order would reduce crime and anti-social behaviour taking place either on, or facilitated by the existence of, the public highway. This Order may be cited as the Staffordshire County Council (Reservoir Road to B.O.A.T. 18 Cannock Town) Gating Order 2008.

##### **By this Order:**

1. The public right of way, being a relevant highway, and being a public highway known and recorded on the Definitive Map and Statement of Public Rights of Way as Byway Open to All Traffic (B.O.A.T.) No 18 Cannock Town, leading from its junction with Reservoir Road,

and comprising the entire length of the aforementioned highway, will be restricted at all times for all classes of public user except pedestrians and enforced by the erection of barriers or gates shown on the annexed plan and depicted by a thick black line.

2. The Authority are satisfied that:

- (a) Premises adjoining or adjacent to the highway are affected by crime or anti-social behaviour;
- (b) The existence of the highway is facilitating the persistent commission of criminal offences or anti-social behaviour.
- (c) It is in all the circumstances expedient to make the Order for the purposes of reducing crime or anti-social behaviour.

3. There are no alternative routes available for vehicular traffic. The alternative route for equestrians and cyclists is via Public Bridleways 15 and 17 Cannock Town

4. Police, Fire and Ambulance emergency services, statutory undertakers with equipment situated under, over, along or in the highway, council officers and other persons authorised in writing by the County Council for the purposes of carrying out works of repair or maintenance to the highway or adjoining premises shall be exempt from the provisions of this Order.

5. The person responsible for erecting and maintaining gates or barriers is Cannock Chase District Council, PO Box 28, Beecroft Road, Cannock, Staffs, WS11 1BG. If any person wishes to question the validity of this Order on the ground that the County Council has no power to make it, or any requirement of Part 8A of the Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order, he or she may apply to the High Court within six weeks from the date which the Order is made.
