Access Land

Statement: Areas of land designated by Natural England under the Countryside and Rights of Way Act 2000. Commonly known as the 'right to roam', this right covers some of Staffordshire's most wild and dramatic landscapes, heaths, moors, down and areas of registered common land.

Historic Landscape Character (HLC) Layers

Statement: These are extracts from the HLC Programme carried out by Staffordshire County Council for the county of Staffordshire, including the area administered by the unitary authority of Stoke-on-Trent City Council. The work was done in partnership with English Heritage as part of a national programme. The overall objective of the HLC project was to characterise, or describe, the county's historic landscape to produce a character map for the entire county. This will aid the understanding and management of the Staffordshire landscape.

The primary objective of the map layers provided are:

1. Historic Landscape Character: To provide a very broad understanding of the 21st century landscape of Staffordshire as identified by the original HLC project.
2. 19th Century HLC: To provide an understanding of the landscape of Staffordshire by the later 19th century as identified by the original HLC project.
3. Medieval HLC: To provide an understanding of the landscape of Staffordshire by the later medieval/early post medieval period as identified by the original HLC project.
