

HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

Section 129A GATING ORDER

STAFFORDSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (HOLLYWOOD LANE, NEWCASTLE-UNDER-LYME) GATING ORDER 2011.

This Order is made by Staffordshire County Council ("the Authority") under Section 129A of the Highways Act 1980 because it appears to the Authority that a Gating Order would reduce crime and anti-social behaviour taking place either on, or facilitated by the existence of, the public highway. This Order may be cited as the Staffordshire County Council (Hollywood Lane, Newcastle-under-Lyme) Gating Order 2011.

By this Order:

1. The public right of way, being a relevant highway, and being a public highway known as Hollywood Lane in the Parish of Keele in the District of Newcastle-under-Lyme Borough Council, and comprising the following part of the aforementioned highway, that is between the junction of Public Footpath No 4 Keele Parish and Hollywood Lane to the junction of Hollywood Lane and Pepper Street, will be restricted all times for vehicular use, whether mechanically propelled or not, and enforced by the erection of barriers or gates at the points shown on the annexed plan and depicted by a thick black line.
2. The Authority are satisfied that:
 - (a) Premises adjoining or adjacent to the highway are affected by crime or anti-social behaviour;
 - (b) The existence of the highway is facilitating the persistent commission of criminal offences or anti-social behaviour.
 - (c) It is in all the circumstances expedient to make the Order for the purposes of reducing crime or anti-social behaviour.
3. There is no alternative route for vehicular users.
4. Police, Fire and Ambulance emergency services, statutory undertakers with equipment situated under, over, along or in the highway, council officers and other persons authorised in writing by the County Council for the purposes of carrying out works of repair or maintenance to the highway or adjoining premises shall be exempt from the provisions of this Order.
5. The person responsible for erecting and maintaining gates or barriers is Newcastle-under-Lyme Borough Council.

If any person wishes to question the validity of this Order on the ground that the County Council has no power to make it, or any requirement of Part 8A of the Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order, he or she may apply to the High Court within six weeks from the date which the Order is made.

Plan

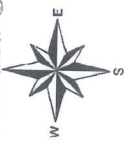
