




# We want all people with a disability to:



 Be able to do things for themselves as much as they can with a focus on ability rather than disability




Stay independent for as long as they can

 Use what is available in their communities rather than using paid for services



# Why?










- The Care Act wants people to do this

# What about the support we need?

A FEW people will need ongoing support to

Meet their needs. We will do this in the most effective & efficient way.

**SOME** people with disabilities will need help and support quickly. Doing this well can **Delay** increased need.

Many people with disabilities would benefit from early help or targeted support to **Reduce** need later in life.

We would expect that **ALL** people with a disability will benefit from access to good quality accessible information, advice and guidance from universal services to help **Prevent** need



#### Prevent





- We want to give people with a disability and their families good information and advice at the right time like:
  - How to do things themselves rather than someone else doing things for them
- This will help them to cope better themselves and help them need less help in the future



### Reduce



 By giving early, targeted, time limited support, people may not need as much support later on in life

This might be things like :



 Support to use services like everyone else – transport, leisure, employment, exercise, health... and others.



# Delay



 We know that a lot of disabled people cope well with everyday life




- Sometimes people need a bit more help at certain times to stop them from needing services straight away like:
  - Coming out of hospital
  - When their carers need help





### Meet







 We will meet only their eligible needs and make sure that the support they get helps them to live as independently as possible but:



- Within the money available
- People may not get their preferred choice of care support
