Your child's nursery, preschool or childminder may be able to apply for extra funding to support your child's education.

The money is to help your child:-

- benefit from extra resources and equipment suited to their needs
- experience and enjoy new play and learning activities
- receive support with speech, language and communication
- be better prepared for starting school.

EYPP cannot be used to reduce your fees.





IS MY CHILD ELIGIBLE?



If your 3 or 4 year old gets up to 15 hours of funded childcare (universal entitlement) and your family claims one of the benefits listed below, ask your childcare provider to apply.

- Universal credit (household income must be less than £7,400 a year after tax, not including any benefits)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided they are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190
- Working tax credit run-on, which is paid for 4 weeks after they stop qualifying for working tax credit
