**CX055 - Notification of overnight carriageway reconstruction works on
the A444 Stanton Road and Violet Way Roundabout scheme, Burton-
Upon-Trent**

As part of the Council's ongoing investment into its roads in Staffordshire, Amey Services Ltd working with Staffordshire County Council, will shortly begin carrying out works on the A444 Stanton Road and Violet Way Traffic Island scheme. Works to include Stanton Road (roundabout and approaches), and sections of Violet Way. Works will include the removal of the existing carriageway surface and replacing it with a new surface (and associated preparatory works known as 'civil works'), alongside kerbing replacement and renewal of ironwork. This location was highlighted by the local County Councillor for Burton Tower, Conor Wileman.

From **Monday 11 August 2025 at 7pm**, we'll begin the overnight scheme of works, where we'll start the civil works. Following on from the civils works, we'll begin removing the existing carriageway surface and re-setting the carriageway ironworks. The new carriageway surface will then be laid, ahead of emptying the highway gullies and finally replacing the new road markings. All works are due to be completed by **Friday 22 August 2025**.

To allow the carriageway reconstruction works to be carried out safely, and to minimise disruption, we'll be working **overnight** between the hours of **7pm to 6am (Monday to Friday)** when traffic volumes are lower.

Due to the size and scale of construction machines being used and to ensure the safety of the general public and workforce, sections of the carriageway will at times become impassable and therefore, it will be necessary to close the A444 Stanton Road after the junction of Saxon Street to Holly Street. Including the junction of Violet Way to Marston Rise to through traffic during the overnight works. The road closures will be in place overnight from **7pm to 6am (Monday to Friday)**. Outside of these times, the roads will remain open.

During the works, there will be limited access within the working area for periods of time whilst materials are being removed and cured. Access for residents living on Violet Way will be via the local diversion route. This is for safety of the public and the safety of the workforce. Designated personnel will be positioned at either end of the closure points to offer advice and assist with access to properties within the closure points.

A signed diversion route will be in place during the closures; along with designated personnel at either end of the closure points to offer assistance with residential properties access.

Emergency services will be given access through the road closures when safe to do so.

Pedestrian access along the length of the works will be maintained throughout.

We recognise that there is never a good time to undertake road works, however we have planned to undertake this scheme of works during the school holidays. This will help to minimise disruption to the local area, in particular when traffic volumes are reduced, enabling the works to be completed as soon as possible. Please allow extra time for your journeys and, where possible, please use alternative routes to avoid delays. Please do not ignore road closure signage.

Regrettably, bus stops along the scheme of works will be suspended during the overnight road closures. If you require any further information about this service, please speak to your bus operator.

Unfortunately, with any major highway works, some disturbance is unavoidable, and there may be short delays even on the approaches to the closure points. We must ask that you drive carefully and slowly through any sections of live roadworks for both the workforces and your own safety.

Please note that all dates are subject to change due to operational requirements and weather conditions. Weekend working may be used where necessary.

The works may at times be noisy, and we apologise in advance for any inconvenience or disturbance caused. We'll do our best to complete the work as quickly and safely as possible. We like to thank you for your patience during this works.
