

Civil Parking Enforcement Annual Report 2013/14





















Parking Enforcement

Civil Parking Enforcement (CPE) in Staffordshire covers the eight Districts' Civil Enforcement Areas (CEA's) and Staffordshire County Council (SCC) has an arrangement with the districts for them to manage the enforcement of all on-street areas in addition to their own off-street surface and multi-storey car parks. Stoke on Trent Council provides the back office administration. The CPE service is branded as "Clear Streets" and is controlled by a Joint Parking Board with representatives from the County and District Councils involved.

The CPE service continues to aim to fulfil the objectives laid out in the Council's Policy:

- Maintain and, where possible, improve the flow of traffic thereby making the County a more pleasant and environmentally safe place to live and visit.
- Take into account the needs of local residents, shops and businesses, thereby sustaining the County and District Council's economic growth.
- Actively support the needs of disabled people bearing in mind that, in some cases, they are unable to use public transport and are entirely dependent upon the use of a car. This will ensure that people with disabilities are able to have equal access to all facilities within the County.
- Actively discourage indiscriminate parking that causes obstruction to other motorists, public transport, pedestrians, cyclists and people with disabilities. This will ensure that the Districts remain accessible to all equally and safely.

Some key results this year are:

- Public satisfaction with measures to tackle inconsiderate parking continues to improve;
- Three new Resident's Parking Schemes have been implemented with more in development, allowing more Staffordshire residents to park closer to their homes;
- The level of Penalty Charge Notices issued in 2013/14 increased overall by slightly under 4% with an increased number in five districts, a slight fall in two and a significant fall in the remaining one.
- There was a slight reduction in the percentage of Penalty Charge Notices issued for which payment was received in the period (72% in 2013/14 compared to 72% in 2012/13)
- Over 85% of Penalty Charge Notices are paid for at the discounted rate





- Slightly fewer than 36% of Penalty Charge Notices issued receive representations. The level of representation varies in each district from 31% to 39%.
- Of those Penalty Charge Notices that receive representation, 35% are cancelled in accordance with the Policy for the Processing of Penalty Charge Notices. The majority of cancellations are related to failure to correctly display blue badges or paid for parking tickets.
- Less than 1 in 1000 tickets are referred to appeal at the Traffic Penalty Tribunal with only 16 cases allowed demonstrating that good policies are in place, good decisions are being made locally by enforcement staff during representations to Stoke-on-Trent City Council Parking service and by district council officers.
- The on-street service continues to operate at an overall net cost to the County Council of £163.8k in 2013/14 with six of the eight district accounts in deficit. Enforcement activities operate at a net cost in all districts. The combined net cost of enforcement is in excess of £300k. Two districts are in surplus primarily as a consequence of on-street charging with any surplus being used to pay back previous deficits or, invest in additional traffic management measures as required by the legislation.
- The median cost of issuing an on-street Penalty Charge Notice is £52 with a range from £32 to £94.





Resident's Parking Permit Schemes

In many of Staffordshire's towns and villages inconsiderate and illegal parking can cause road safety problems, congestion, obstruction and considerable inconvenience to residents and businesses. More efficient enforcement of parking restrictions will help alleviate many of the problems being experienced. In some areas, where there is a great desire for on-street parking resulting in conflict between the needs of residents, businesses and those requiring shorter term parking such as shoppers and commuters, priorities need to be set.

A Resident's parking scheme will not provide more parking for Residents where demand exceeds the space available; however it will limit the amount of vehicles in the area giving all residents a better chance of parking close to their home. It is important that any scheme has the support of the residents affected and as such the Council will consult heavily to ensure their views and wishes are taken into account as much as is possible.

Each local Joint Parking Committee, consisting of members of the County and District Council oversees the Resident's Parking Zones in that area.

Currently there are four schemes in operation, with a further 2 under consideration.

We have issued:

- 280 Resident's Permits
- 34 Visitor's Permits
- 10 Blue Badge Holder Permits
- 51 Senior Citizen Permits
- 7 Carer Permits
- 10 Property Owner Permits
- 11 Business Permits






National Highways and Transportation Survey

The NHT Public Satisfaction Survey collects public perspectives on, and satisfaction with, highways and transportation services in local authority areas. It is a postal survey, conducted by IPSOS Mori, with questionnaires sent to a minimum sample of 4,500 households in each participating local authority area. Staffordshire County Council has participated in the annual survey since its inception in 2008.

Section 13 of the survey seeks views on the way traffic is managed and asks two questions on parking related matters.


Question 13.4 - How satisfied or dissatisfied are you with measures to tackle illegal onstreet parking?

Satisfaction with measures to tackle on-street parking has risen in Staffordshire and across the CIPFA group since 2008. The survey period coincides with the introduction of Decriminalised Parking Enforcement in 2007/08. In 2013, residents in Staffordshire were again slightly more satisfied than the average of the group.



Question 13.5 - How satisfied or dissatisfied are you with restrictions of parking on busy roads

Similarly, satisfaction with restrictions of parking on busy roads has also risen in Staffordshire and across the CIPFA group since 2008. In 2013, residents in Staffordshire were slightly less satisfied than the average of the group.












