**PUBLIC PATH CREATION AND DEFINITIVE MAP AND STATEMENT
MODIFICATION ORDER**

This Order is made by Staffordshire County Council ("the authority") under Section 26 of the Highways Act 1980 ("the 1980 Act") because it appears to the authority that having regard to the matters set out in Section 26(1), there is a need for a public footpath over the land to which this Order relates, and that it is expedient that the path should be created.

This Order is also made under Section 53A(2) of the Wildlife & Countryside Act 1981 ("the 1981 Act") because it appears to the authority that the Definitive Map and Statement for the District of Staffordshire Moorlands require modification in consequence of the occurrence of an event specified in Section 53(3)(a)(i) of the 1981 Act, namely the creation (as authorised by this Order) of a highway shown or required to be shown in the Map and Statement.


Staffordshire County Council has agreed to defray any expenses which are incurred in bringing the new site of the path into a fit condition or use by the public.

Staffordshire Moorlands District Council have been consulted and have consented to the making of the Order as required by Section 26(3) of the 1980 Act.

BY THIS ORDER

1. There shall be, at the end of 28 days from the date of confirmation of this Order, a public footpath over the land at Biddulph Town described in (part 1 of) the Schedule to this Order and shown by a bold broken line on the map attached to this Order.
2. The Definitive Statement for the District of Staffordshire Moorlands shall be modified as described in Part 4 of the Schedule to this Order.
3. The rights conferred on the public under this Order shall be subject to the Limitations and Conditions set out in Part 3 of the Schedule.

PART 1

DESCRIPTION OF SITE OF NEW PATH

A new length of Public Footpath in Biddulph Town running from its junction with Portland Drive at a point in between properties 27 and 29 Portland Drive at point A on the Order plan (383772 358704) and running in a generally easterly direction for approximately 75 metres to its junction with Congleton Road in between properties 195 and 193 Congleton Road at point B on the Order plan (388841 358682).

The new route shall have a prescribed width of 2 metres between points A-B.

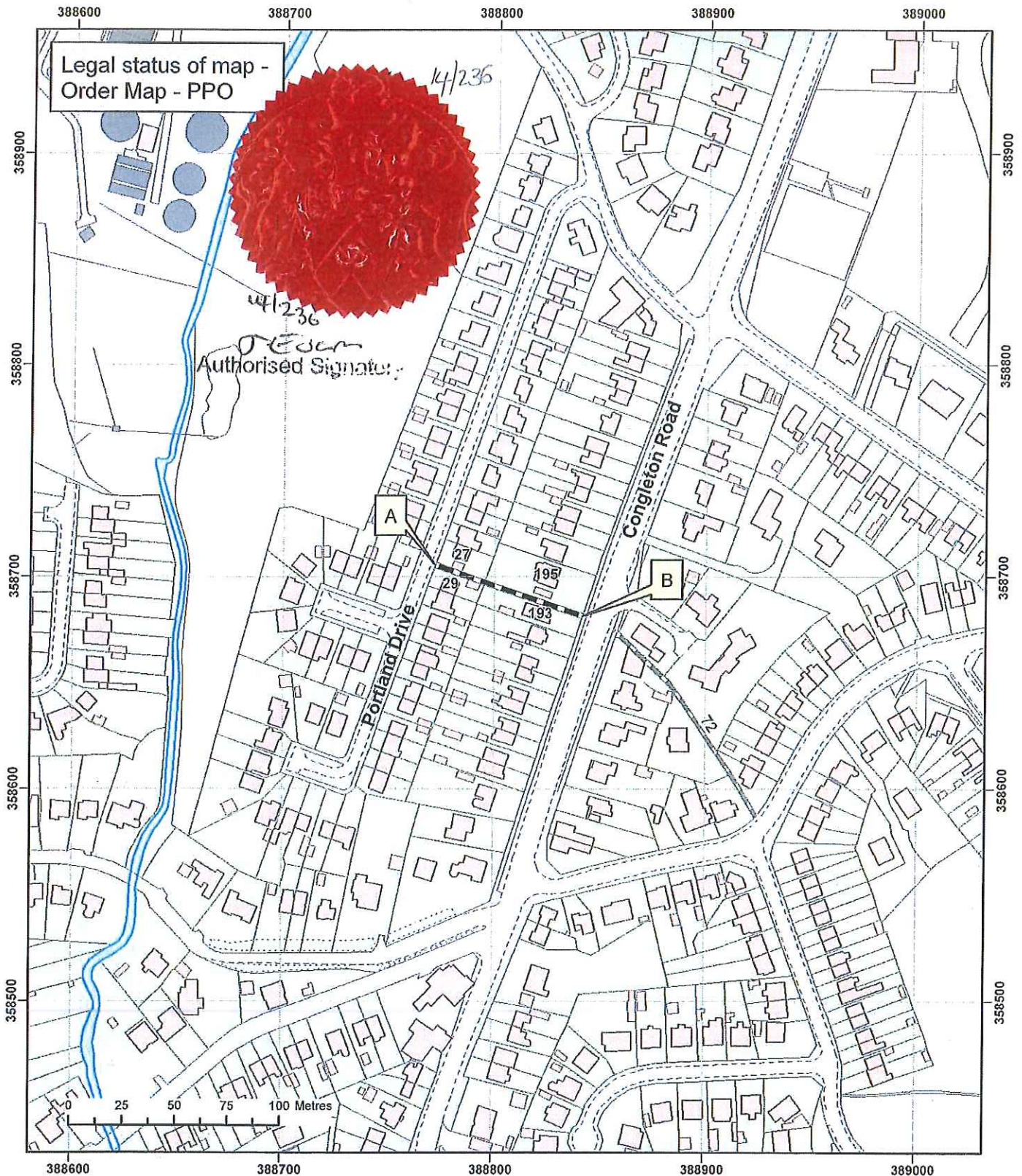
