### **Public Path Diversion Order**

Public Path Diversion Order 2011
Public Footpaths Nos. 100 Ipstones Parish and 31, Onecote Parish

This Order is made by Staffordshire County Council ("the Authority") under Section 119 of the Highways Act 1980 ("the 1980 Act") because it appears to the authority that in the interests of the public, the footpath described in paragraph 1 of this Order it is expedient that the line of the path should be diverted.

Staffordshire Moorlands District Council has been consulted to the making of the Order as required by section 120(2) of the 1980 Act.

#### BY THIS ORDER

- 1. The public right of way over land situate at Ipstones and shown by a bold continuous line on the map contained in this Order and described in Part I of the Schedule to this Order shall be stopped up after 28 days from the date of confirmation of this order.
- 2. Notwithstanding this Order where immediately before the date upon which the footpath is diverted there is apparatus under, in, on, along or across it belonging to statutory undertakers for the purpose of carrying on their undertaking, the undertakers shall continue to have the same rights in respect of the apparatus as they then had.
- 3. There shall be at the end of 28 days from the date of confirmation of this order a public footpath over the land situate at Ipstones described in Part II of the Schedule and shown by a bold broken line on the map contained in this order.
- 4. The rights conferred upon the public under this Order shall be subject to any limitations and conditions set out in Part III of the Schedule.

#### Schedule

# Part I

**Description of Existing Path** 

That length of Public Footpath No. 100, Ipstones Parish, commencing from a point approximately 68 metres south west of the start of the farm drive at Longditch Farm (point B on the Order plan, Grid Ref:SK062519) and running in a generally north westerly direction for approximately 75 metres (point C on the attached map, Grid Ref:SK061519).

Also that length of Public Footpath No. 31, Onecote Parish commencing from a point approximately 28 metres from the start of the farm track at Longditch Farm (point A on the Order plan, Grid Ref:SK063520) and running in a generally south westerly direction for approximately 38 metres to point B on the Order plan, Grid Ref:SK062519).

Part II
Description of New Path

A new length of Public Footpath commencing from a point 56 metres north west of Longditch Farm (point C on the Order plan, Grid Ref:SK061519) and running in a generally south easterly direction for approximately 25 metres (point D on the Order plan, Grid Ref:SK062519).

The new route shall have a prescribed width of 1.8 metres. Between points D and C.




