#### **Public Path Diversion Order**

## Staffordshire County Council Public Path Diversion Order 2011 Public Footpath No. 14, Curborough and Elmhurst Parish

This Order is made by Staffordshire County Council ("the Authority") under Section 119 of the Highways Act 1980 ("the 1980 Act") because it appears to the authority that in the interests of the owners of the land crossed by the footpath described in paragraph 1 of this Order and the public, it is expedient that the line of the path should be diverted.

Mr. K. Crudgington has agreed to defray any expenses which are incurred in bringing the new site of the path into a fit condition for use by the public.

Lichfield District Council have been consulted to the making of the Order as required by section 120(2) of the 1980 Act.

#### BY THIS ORDER

- 1. The public right of way over land situate at Elmhurst and shown by a bold continuous line on the map contained in this Order and described in Part I of the Schedule to this Order shall be stopped up after 28 days from the date of confirmation of this order.
- 2. Notwithstanding this Order where immediately before the date upon which the footpath is diverted there is apparatus under, in, on, along or across it belonging to statutory undertakers for the purpose of carrying on their undertaking, the undertakers shall continue to have the same rights in respect of the apparatus as they then had.
- 3. There shall be at the end of 28 days from the date of confirmation of this order a public footpath over the land situate at Elmhurst described in Part II of the Schedule and shown by a bold broken line on the map contained in this order.
- 4. The rights conferred upon the public under this Order shall be subject to any limitations and conditions set out in Part III of the Schedule.

#### Schedule

#### Part I

Description of Existing Path

That length of Public Footpath No. 14, Curborough and Elmhurst Parish running from Nash Lane (point B on the Order plan, Grid Ref:SK114122) through the gardens of three properties and in a generally southerly direction for approximately 205 metres to point A on the Order plan (Grid Ref:SK114120).

#### Part II

**Description of New Path** 

A new length of Public Footpath No. 14, Curborough and Elmhurst Parish will be created, running from a new junction with Nash Lane (point C on the Order plan, Grid Ref:SK114121 approximately 102 metres south west of its original junction) and

running in a generally south-south-easterly direction to point A on the Order plan (Grid Ref:SK114120)

The new route shall have a prescribed width of 2 metres between points C and A.

### Part III Limitations and Conditions

There are no recorded limitations or conditions in respect of this path.



A new length of Public Footpath 14, Curborough and Elmhurst Parish, commencing from a new junction with Nash Lane (point C on the Order plan, Grid Ref:SK114121 approximately 102 metres south west of its original junction) and running in a generally south-south-easterly direction to point A on the Order plan, Grid Ref:SK114120). The new route shall have a prescribed width of 2 metres between points C and A.
